

Battles and the Different Strategies God used

Battles	Strategy of victory God Used
Pharaoh Pursues the Israelites in Exodus – Exodus 14	God drowned the enemies of Israel. And the waters returned, and covered the chariots, and the horsemen, <i>and</i> all the host of Pharaoh that came into the sea after them; there remained not so much as one of them (Exodus 14:28)
The Israelites Fight Back against the Amalekites – Exodus 17:8-16	God destroyed the Egyptians without the Israelites ever fighting. They never lifted a finger but got absolute victory. Exodus 17:8-15. Moses by rising of his hand, Israel prevailed against Amalek. Write this for a memorial in a book, and rehearse it in the ears of Joshua: Moses lifting up his hand is symbolic of using God's power in intercession for victory of the troops.
Israel Marches on the City of Jericho – Joshua 6	Marched around the city six days and shouted with a great shout
Israel's Struggle with the City of Ai – Joshua 7-8	God dealt with the Sin in the Camp then only Israel got victory from its enemies (Ai).
Joshua Leads Israel against the Five Amorite Kings – Joshua 10 (Deuteronomy 9:5)	Discomfited and the Sun stood still as the Israelites slaughtered their enemies.

King Jabin of Hazor with a Great Army Opposes Joshua and Israel – Joshua 11	Surprise attack. Joshua 11:7 So Joshua came, and all the people of war with him, against them by the waters of Merom suddenly; and they fell upon them.
Gideon's 300 Rise Up against the Midianites – Judges 7–8:21	Gideon's 300 men with lamps, trumpets and pitchers defeated 120,000 men with swords. Judges 7:16, 20; 8:10
Samson defeats his enemies and those of Israel. Judges 14:6 Judges 14:19 Judges 15:15	Judges 14:6 The spirit of the Lord came upon Samson, and he rent (tore) a lion into pieces with his bare hands. Judges 14:19–Samson slew 30 men in Ashkelon. Judges 15:15 – with a jawbone of an ass, Samson slew one thousand men (1000 men).
Saul Leads Israel against the Amalekites – 1 Samuel 15:1–9 (15:19, 33) The Battle of the Valley of Elah, David verses Goliath – 1 Samuel 17	David killed a lion and a bear with hands 1 Sam 17:34–36. A man with sling and a stone defeated a man experienced in battle. A huge man with a sword, with a shield, with an armor, with an armor bearer too. 1 Sam 17:40, 50. David revealed how he came against Goliath “in the name of the lord of the hosts, the God of the armies of Israel.” 1 Sam 17:45
David Saves the City of Keilah and Out Maneuvers King Saul – 1 Samuel 23 (21:1–15; 22:1–5)	David played a mad man to save his life. This is a strange strategy, but it worked. Who would have thought that such a strategy would ever work but it did?
David Saves the City of Ziklag – 1 Samuel 30	God told David to pursue the Amalekites and he would overtake them. He pursued them and recovered all.
The Ammonite Rebellion – 2 Samuel 10	Enemies fled

Absalom's Rebellion – 2 Samuel 18 (2 Sam 13–17)	2Sa 18:9 And Absalom met the servants of David. And Absalom rode upon a mule, and the mule went under the thick boughs of a great oak, and his head caught hold of the oak, and he was taken up between the heaven and the earth; and the mule that was under him went away.
Israel's King Ambushes Judah and gets destroyed – 2 Chronicles 13	400,000 (Judah) Vs 800,000 (Israel). Victory was for Judah.
Ethiopia's Army, Greater than One Million, Attacks Judah – 2 Chronicles 14	Outnumbered Israel destroys its attackers. 580,000 Vs 1,000,300 Ethiopians.
King Jehoshaphat's Army of Judah Worships and Sings in the Face of Battle – 2 Chronicles 20	2 Chronicles 20 – By praising and worshipping God , all the enemies of Judah were defeated for the Lord set ambushments against the children of Ammon, Moab and mount sier which were coming against Judah, and they were defeated. It took Judah 30 days gathering the spoils for it was too much – verse 25.
Israel and Judah Joined Together to Defeat the Moabites – 2 Kings 3	Unity of both Kings and a trap. Their enemies saw the water as blood and thought that the Kings had been slain. They came in and they were destroyed by the Israelites.
The Syrian Army Come to Conquer Israel including Elisha – 2 Kings 6:8–7:20	Eyes blinded
The Assyrian Invasion by King Sennacherib – 2 Kings 18–19 (2 Chronicles 32:20–21)	Defeated by the angel of the Lord.
