Ways to study:

- 1. Topical
- 2. Character studies
- 3. Expository
- 4. Expo-topical—this is my style of study. As I study expository, I get topical messages as well.

E-sword download all the free versions-Including translations, commentaries, and dictionaries.

A select editor, create new pages, and begin to break-down. Always save.

Steps in E-sword

Major nouns and verbs (list them one by one)

- a) You can also break these down based on punctuation such as commas or semicolons.
- b) Holy Spirit thoughts
 - i) Log the Holy Spirit thoughts immediately when you get them. Stop whatever you are doing.
- c) References i.e., Scriptures and verses.
 - i) Use the Tsk
 - ii) Holy spirit thoughts from the references.
- d) Commentary.
 - i) Always use the commentaries after you have given the Holy Spirit a chance to speak to you through Holy Spirit thoughts.

- e) Examples and illustrations: You need these to help people relate.
 - i) Personal
 - ii) From the word

Example: James 4:7; 1 Peters 5:8-9; Romans 10:3; 1 Timothy 4:1-8

James 4:7 Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

- A) Submit Yourself therefore unto God
 - a) Submit
 - i) Submitting to His Word is submitting to Him.
 - b) Yourself
 - i) You are the one to submit yourself. If you are forced, then that is not submission, but humiliation.
 - c) Unto God
 - i) Your submission ought to be to God. Practically, this would be submitting to His Word.
- B) Resist the devil
 - a) This is saying you resist the devil, not God.
 - b) This also reveals that you should not be friendly to the devil. He is an enemy. You want to resist (actively fight against) Him.
- C) and he will flee from you.
 - a) He will flee. There is nothing like he is stringer and won't flee. There is nothing like he will hang around forever.
 - b) This happens only if you resist him. If you do not, he will not.
