

The Word of God is not bound

The Word of God is powerful, and it is limitless. It cannot be stopped. The Word of God still has the same power it has carried before. It is still powerful.

2 Timothy 2:9 *Wherein I suffer trouble, as an evil doer, even unto bonds; but the word of God is not bound.*

- a) The Word of God is effective and works in and out of season.
- b) The Word of God is not limited by distance or time. It is not in lockdown.
- c) There is no season the Word of God does not work. It works and it is infallible.
- d) We need to put faith in the Word of God.
- e) We need to put pressure and our expectations on the Word of God and His promises, not on people.
- f) *Philippians 1:12-13 But I would ye should understand, brethren, that the things which happened unto me have fallen out rather unto the furtherance of the gospel; 13 So that my bonds in Christ are manifest in all the palace, and in all other places;*

Isaiah 55:10-11 For as the rain cometh down, and the snow from heaven, and returneth not thither, but watereth the earth, and maketh it bring forth and bud, that it may give seed to the sower, and bread to the eater: So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it.

- a) God's word never fails. He says and it is established. He compared it to how rain and snow comes down from heaven and waters the ground.
 - i) God's word is infallible. This is what this is saying. It's a seed that will grow and bring forth fruit. It will prosper and excel in what it's directed to do. It always produces.
 - ii) It accomplishes what God desires and pleases. God's Word does not accomplish whatever, but that which is only according to God's will, heart, and desire.

And that from a child thou hast known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works.

—2 Timothy 3:15-17

- a) Able to make you wise unto Salvation
 - i) God's word is and has the wisdom of God and can make us wise. We should take it seriously and humble ourselves and receive it, for it is able to save our souls (James 1:21).
- b) Given by Inspiration of God
 - i) The Greek word for "Inspiration" means "divinely breathed" (Strong's Concordance).
- c) Profitable for Doctrine
 - i) The Greek word for profitable" used in this verse means "helpful or serviceable, that is, advantageous" (Strong's Concordance).
- d) Reproof.
 - i) The Greek word for "reproof" in this verse means "proof, conviction" (Strong's Concordance).
- e) Correction.

- i) The Greek word for “correction” in this verse means “*a straightening up again*, that is, (figuratively) *rectification* (reformation)” (Strong’s Concordance).
- f) Instruction in righteousness.
- i) The Greek word for “Instruction used in this verse means “*tutorage*, that is, *education or training*, by implication disciplinary correction” (Strong’s Concordance).
- g) Make you perfect.
- i) The Greek word for “perfect” used in this verse means “fresh, that is, (by implication) complete” (Strong’s Concordance).
- h) Thoroughly furnished unto all good works.
- i) The Greek word for “furnished” used in this verse means “to finish out (time); figuratively to equip fully” (Strong’s Concordance).

When the even was come, they brought unto him many that were possessed with devils: and he cast out the spirits with his word, and healed all that were sick: 17 That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying, Himself took our infirmities, and bare our sicknesses.

- a) Casts out demons by His Word

For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.

—Hebrews 4:12

But straightway Jesus spake unto them, saying, Be of good cheer; it is I; be not afraid. 28 And Peter answered him and said, Lord, if it be thou, bid me come unto thee on the water. 29 And he

said, Come. And when Peter was come down out of the ship, he walked on the water, to go to Jesus.

—Mathew 14:27-29

- a) Peter heard the Word of God and then walked on water. Without the Word, he could not walk on water. It is safe to say that he walked on the Word of God. This further reveals how powerful and reliable God's Word is.
- b) Ephesians 5:26 That he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word,

And the word of God increased; and the number of the disciples multiplied in Jerusalem greatly; and a great company of the priests were obedient to the faith.

—Acts 6:7

- a) The Word of God is increasing

Not as though the word of God hath taken none effect. For they are not all Israel, which are of Israel:

- a) The Word of God hath not failed if though it looks like it was of none effect.
