

Rebuke

"Rebuke" simply means to hate, refuse, curse, trash, smear, defame the enemy, ridicule, blaspheme, speak evil of him as a loser he is.

Here is an example of how I rebuke.

- o Satan listen to me now. I am not your friend or buddy and I will never be.
- o Yes, you know my voice and you know my command. You have heard me before. I am back to torment you. Yes, Jesus you know and Rich you know (Acts 19:15).
- You nasty thing you, filthy, stinkin' Satan or foul spirit, spirit of infirmity, garbage, rotten piece of junk, defeated foe, loser, candidate of hell.
- o Sickness or Satan, you got the wrong address.
- o You are getting crashed for trespassing.
- o You are not welcome.
- o The person you are looking for moved many years ago.
- o You missed your turn to hell filthy rotten spirit.
- o You are **lost** and therefore get **lost** you naked creep in Jesus' name.
- o Pain, sickness, and disease, you know who the boss is, and it is not you. Now do as I say quickly. Body listen to me. You

serve me and I am your boss. Listen to my command and respond immediately and quickly in Jesus' name.

I get ugly, mean, rough and mad when rebuking sickness, disease, or Satan the author of it.

Jesus called the evil spirit a foul spirit that was dumb and deaf and, on another instance, called it the spirit of infirmity. This is a way of taking our God given authority. Very few people do this, but rather just use the words, "I rebuke you Satan "but this means very little. What I have described a few sentences above is truly rebuking. When we rebuke, we need to speak or say the rebuke. We rebuke by saying—not by saying, "I rebuke you."

- a) Mark 4:39 And he arose, and rebuked the wind, and said unto the sea, **Peace**, **be still**. And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.
- b) Mark 9:25 When Jesus saw that the people came running together, he rebuked the foul spirit, saying unto him, Thou dumb and deaf spirit, I charge thee, come out of him, and enter no more into him.
- c) Mark 8:33 But when he had turned about and looked on his disciples, he rebuked Peter, saying, Get thee behind me, Satan: for thou savourest not the things that be of God, but the things that be of men.
